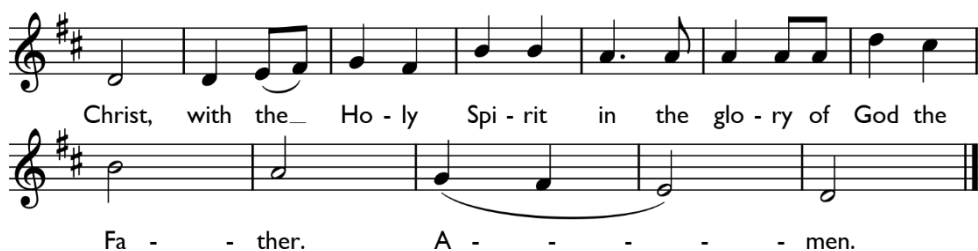

Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. Love does no wrong to a neighbour; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.

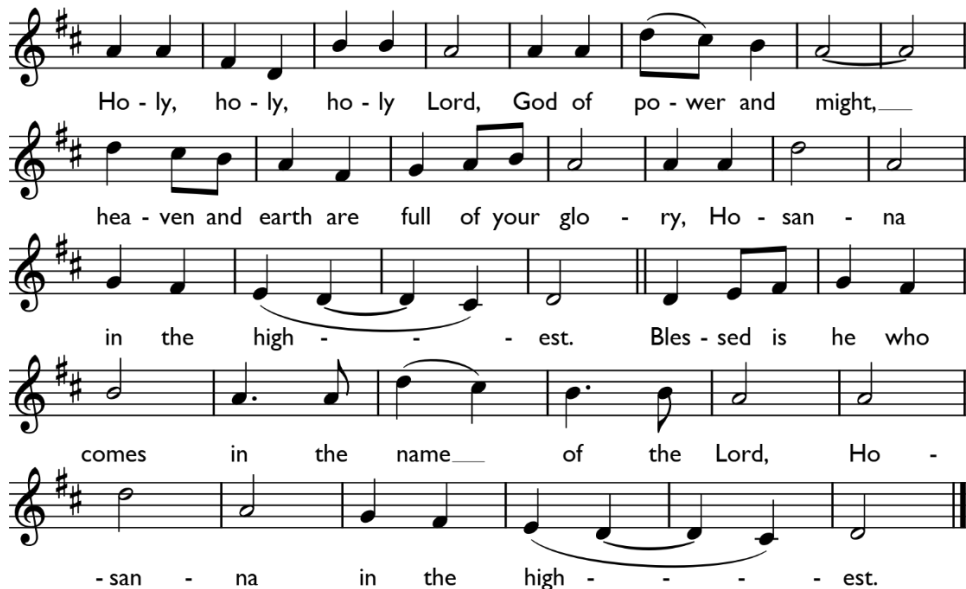
It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation,
